As mentioned many, many times before, we do not know your financial information, but our goal is to have each family donate what they can. Weather it is \$1.00 or \$1,000, it is up to you. Every little bit will help us meet our goal of 100% family participation. FOS pledge cards are available in our troop mail boxes.

Friends of Scouting is the annual campaign where the San Francisco Bay Area Council asks Scouting families, business and civic-minded citizens to support our mission of providing the Scouting program to thousands of young people in the Bay Area. The registration fees paid each year goes directly to the National Office of the Boy Scouts of America, whereas, the funds collected during the FOS campaign stays with the local council and helps with items such as maintaining our council camps, camperships for summer camp, and day camp programs. This is a council campaign, not a troop fundraiser.



Troop 726 – Summer Camp Week 2011

<u>Troop 726 is returning to one of our favorite Scout camps June 19- 25, 2011</u>! SFBAC Camp Royaneh, one of the oldest and most scenic Boy Scout camps, is located among serene redwood groves along Austin Creek near the Russian River, about 30min west of Santa Rosa not far from the rugged Sonoma coast.

Please mark your family calendars for Sun 06/19 through Sat 06/25!

This big event is considered by most of our boys to be their best annual Scouting experience, and we would like to see 100% participation by all patrols, especially since we will be attending our own council's summer camp program. As announced previously, the estimated cost of this trip would be \$415, but the troop committee leadership has voted to subsidize part of the cost from the unit's general fund, therefore the charge is only \$325 per Scout (plus special merit badge fees). The initial deposit of \$150 and signed parental permission slip below is due by Tuesday February 22nd (to Mr. Yi. Michael Yi's Dad). Please budget for the remaining balance of \$175, and plan an appointment for the doctor-approved BSA health form to be completed ASAP (turn in to Mrs. McGrue, Larry Whitmeyer's mom). These final details are due by Wednesday March 23rd, payment from Scout acct, check payable to Troop 726, or apply to the SFBAC Campership family financial aid link (www.sfbac.org).








Sled Building at Troop Meeting
