March on the Capital, Oct 23 - 25


Scout in Charge: TBD, Adult in Charge: Mr. Guerin






Brownsea Training (by Scout in Charge: Bryce Fong)



Online Training from your computer is available for Boy Scout Fast Start, Youth Protection, Safe Swim and Safety Afloat, Troup Committee Challenge and many more. Please check out all the online trainings. These are free online. Please go to www.SFBAC.org, then go to training, >adult training, >the training program and than select online training for the above. You will need to register.

EVERY SCOUT DESERVES A TRAINED LEADER!

The following trainings will be held:

- 1. <u>Roundtable</u> every month. Meet people and have fun learning more about scouting. Second Thursday evening of each month at the Boy Scout Center in San Leandro.
- 2. <u>Did you complete any training lately?</u> Please let me know. A copy of your training card would be the best. For example, University of Scouting or HAT trainings.
- 3. <u>Beginning January 2009</u>, leaders will be required to renew Youth Protection, Safety Afloat and Safe Swim every 2 years. This is a <u>new *National Policy*</u> and is required on tour permits.
- 4. Also, <u>beginning January 2009</u>, you will be required to take a training called <u>"Planning"</u> and <u>Preparing for Hazardous Weather Training."</u> This is only available online.
- 5. <u>"This is Scouting"</u> is now on line. If you haven't taken NLE please take this course at <u>www.sfbac.org</u> under adult training.
- 6. <u>Boy Scout Leader Outdoor Training</u> is being offered on Sept 17, and Sept. 26 27, 2009. You need to take this if you're and assistant Scoutmaster as this will probably be REQUIRED beginning Jan. 1, 2010. Please see Mr. Wright for a flyer.

If haven't take Youth Protection in the last two years you need to before you can participate in any outing or programs with our youth. You also are required by National to take the Weather Hazards course if you are a tour leader or are signing the tour permit.
