Trainings offered by the Boy Scout of America online at www.sfbac.org. Proceed to the "My Scouting" section on the right side of the page.

Leader specific for Committee Members can also be taken online and is called *Troop Committee Challenge*.

Leader Specific Training for Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmasters <u>can't</u> be taken online and must be taken as a participant training. These are required for Scoutmasters and their assistants.

- 1. <u>Scout Leader Training</u> an all Saturday or three evening sessions.
- 2. Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skill is a weekend course.

We also require the following trainings if you plan on attending or leading Troop outings pertaining to certain outdoor experiences. 1- 5 can be found online. # 6 is provided to our troop via the Troops instructors. Leave no Trace isn't offered online and must be taken in group training.


Adult Quartermaster and Adult Historian Positions Filled







